

What's the damage? A one-bedroom cottage sleeping two starts at £144 per night, B&B. Andros is two hours by ferry from Athens; once on the island, you can hire jeeps (recommended for navigating the bumpy track to the cottages) for around £35 per day. Enq i-escape.com/onar/overview. Getting there: British Airways, enq ba.com, has return flights to Athens from London Heathrow, from around £250 return. Ferries from Rafina (Athens port) to Andros from Direct Ferries, enq directferries.co.uk, from around £27 return.



ONAR, ANDROS, GREECE

Who recommends it? Abi Dare, i-escape (as before).

What is it? This collection of stone cottages is hidden behind a turquoise cove on the unspoilt Greek island of Andros. Each sleeps two to five people, with an airy living room, a terrace and is stylishly decorated with wooden beams, brushed concrete floors and vibrant modern art. Days revolve around slow walks to beautiful Achlas beach, before evening glasses of wine around a fire and laid-back dinners served under giant plane trees. And you needn't lift a finger - local women come to cook up Mediterranean feasts each day (but they'll do a grocery shop if you'd prefer to self-cater), leaving you to wallow in simple luxuries like sun, sea and silence.

Why it works for you: Few people have heard of Andros – it's only a couple of hours by ferry from Athens, but its rugged countryside and empty beaches are perfect if you need a detox from everyday hustle and bustle. Onar itself is tucked away at the end of a long track, and the secluded setting, fresh food and simple décor will reinvigorate even the most jaded workaholic. Just lock your iPhone in the safe and forget the world.
